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The central inquiry on reviewing a sufficiency claim is not whether this Court believes that the evidence at trial established guilt beyond a reasonable doubt. See *Commonwealth v. Ratsamy*, 934 A.2d 1233, 1235 (Pa. 2007) (citing *Jackson v. Virginia*, 443 U.S. 307, 318-19 (1979)). Rather, this Court determines “whether the evidence believed by the fact-finder was sufficient to support the verdict.” *Id.* at 1236. This undertaking requires that a court “view the evidence in the light most favorable to the verdict winner giving the prosecution the benefit of all reasonable inferences to be drawn from the evidence.” *Commonwealth v. Widmer*, 744 A.2d 745, 751 (Pa. 2000) (citing *Commonwealth v. Chambers*, 599 A.2d 630 (Pa. 1991)).

The Pennsylvania General Assembly defines deviate sexual intercourse, in relevant part, as “[s]exual intercourse . . . per anus between human beings[,] and includes penetration, however slight, of the . . . anus of another person with a foreign object for any purpose other than good faith medical, hygienic or law enforcement procedures.” 18 Pa.C.S. § 3101. The offense of involuntary deviate sexual intercourse requires proof of deviate sexual intercourse with the victim by “forcible compulsion or by threat of forcible compulsion that would prevent resistance by a person of reasonable resolution.” 18 Pa.C.S. § 3123. Forcible compulsion includes, among other things, “compulsion resulting in another person’s death, whether the death occurred before, during or after sexual intercourse.” 18 Pa.C.S. § 3101.

Here, the severity and savagery of the injuries causing Ms. Sarazen’s death constitute circumstantial proof that the anal sex occurred by forcible compulsion. More specifically, Dr. Ross testified that his examination of Ms. Sarazen’s rectal region revealed “deep hemorrhages” and evidence of “forcible penetration with an object or penis.” (N.T. at 306, 329). And Collins’ DNA was recovered from Ms. Sarazen’s rectum. See *id.* at 487-88. The jury’s verdict thus had ample evidentiary support.

For these reasons, Collins’ judgment of sentence should be affirmed.

Commonwealth of Pennsylvania v. Francisco Hernandez-Hernandez

No. 5263-CR-2023

Criminal Action – Third-degree murder, recklessly endangering, persons prohibited from possessing firearms

Shooting an unarmed man in the chest and then proceeding to fire additional shots at him as he attempted to flee inside his home more than adequately satisfies the “wickedness of disposition, hardness of heart, cruelty, recklessness of consequences, and a mind regardless of social duty” definition of malice required for third-degree murder.

Sufficient evidence connected Hernandez to the murder based on an eyewitness who identified the distinctive two-toned shirt worn by him, identified his left-shoulder injury, and Hernandez returned to the scene of the murder wearing the two-toned shirt and favoring his

left shoulder. He provided inconsistent accounts of his actions, he had motive, and he had gunshot residue on his shooting hand.

The verdict against Hernandez was not contradicted by incontrovertible facts, contrary to human experience and the laws of nature, or based on mere conjecture.

Although the 20-year-minimum sentence imposed was at the top-end of the suggested guideline range, Hernandez essentially executed an unarmed man and then continued to shoot him.

OPINION

Josue "Rocky" Saez lodged a reasonable noise complaint with the police about his next-door neighbor's loud music. Then he complained about the noise to that neighbor, Francisco Hernandez-Hernandez ("Hernandez"). And for that, Hernandez took Mr. Saez's life, shooting him three times. A jury found Hernandez guilty of third-degree murder. He appeals, claiming that there was insufficient evidence of his guilt, the verdict was against the weight of the evidence, and he should have received a shorter term of imprisonment.

Factual background

For many years, Mr. Saez, his mother, Benita, and his much younger brother, Daniel Dice, resided in the apartments along 369 North Harrisburg Street in Swatara Township. (N.T. Trial 10/27 – 10/28/2025 at 87) ("N.T. at ___"). Their Apartment, "C", shared a wall and porch with Apartment "D". See *id.* at 88. Since 2008, Mr. Saez had worked for the Pennsylvania Department of Corrections at the State Correctional Institution – Camp Hill. His job involved the classification of incoming inmates, ensuring that they received needed medical or mental health care. See *id.* at 214-15. Mr. Saez's shift, notably, began at 6:00 a.m. See *id.* at 214. Mr. Dice was likewise employed, working for a firearms manufacturing company. See *id.* at 86.

The neighbors and the noise complaints

In August 2023, new people moved into Apartment D, adjacent to Mr. Saez and his family. See (N.T. at 92-93, 355). Although none of the neighbors knew them, they noticed that several individuals were coming and going from that apartment. See *id.* at 92, 156-57, 172, 184. Hernandez, his girlfriend, Yuri, see *id.* at 336, 351, his brother Felix Hernandez-Hernandez, and his girlfriend, Maria, lived in Apartment D. Not long after they

moved in, their neighbors began experiencing loud music from Apartment D, blaring at all hours of the day. *See id.* at 93-95, 126-27, 132, 159, 186. Indeed, the bass sound was enough to shake Mr. Saez's apartment. *See id.* at 93-94. Mr. Saez complained to his neighbors in Apartment D, his neighbors in Apartment A, and Mr. Saez's mother complained to the landlord—all to no avail. *See id.* at 93, 94, 186.

In early October 2023, Mr. Saez had finally had enough. The loud music was preventing him from sleeping and he had to be up early for work. He knocked on the door to Apartment D, but no one responded. (N.T. at 142). So, he called the police. *Id.* At 2:23 a.m. on Sunday, October 8, 2023, Swatara Township police officers responded. *See id.* at 125, 126. Arriving at 369 North Harrisburg Street, the officers immediately heard the music, which in their experience was "unusually loud." *Id.* at 126, 132. When they knocked on the door to Apartment D, no one answered because the music was too loud for anyone to hear their knocking. *See id.* at 127. Through Apartment D's basement window, the officers observed people drinking and dancing. Ultimately, they were able to get someone's attention with a flashlight. *See id.* at 127-28. Maria del Carmen spoke to the officers, apologized, and agreed to turn the music down. *See id.* at 128-29.

But soon after the police departed, the occupants in Apartment D turned up the volume. As a result, the officers were again dispatched for a noise complaint about Apartment D. (N.T. at 133-34). And then they received a call about a damaged door. *See id.* at 134. When the officers arrived, they met with the occupants of Apartment D, who complained about the damage to their door. *See id.* at 134-35. The door had been forced open, and the frame had been damaged. *See id.* at 135. The officers interviewed Mr. Saez, who admitted to forcing the door open and offered to pay for the damage. *See id.* at 134-35. He explained, however, that shortly after the officers left, the people in Apartment D turned up the music, he had to get up early for work, and he was simply tired of the constant noise. *See id.*

From noise complaint to murder in 18 minutes

On Saturday evening November 4, 2023, Apartment D was once again blasting music. There were a number of people in Apartment D partying. A frustrated Mr. Saez alerted his neighbors in Apartment A. *See* (N.T. at 159, 173). And he called the emergency response number—911. *See id.* at 95-96, 147-48. That call occurred at 10:06 p.m. *See id.*

at 146. He was upset with having to repeatedly deal with the loud music and the resulting lack of sleep. *See id.* at 95. When he heard someone leave Apartment D, Mr. Saez made what turned out to be a tragic decision to personally complain to him about the loud music. *See id.* at 97. The discussion was heated. *Id.* Out of concern over the many people in Apartment D and worried that things may get out of hand, Mr. Dice grabbed a 9mm firearm that he was licensed to carry. *See id.* at 98-99. He saw a woman come out of Apartment D. There was a discussion between her, the man from Apartment D, and Mr. Saez. *See id.* at 103. At this point, the man walked over to the basement window to Apartment D, smirked at Mr. Saez, and knocked on the window. *See id.* at 103-04. With that, a crowd came upstairs from Apartment D's basement. *See id.* at 104. They immediately confronted Mr. Saez. *Id.* at 104, 191-92.

Several people hit, punched, and kicked Mr. Saez. (N.T. at 105-06, 173-74, 188). Mr. Dice yelled for them to stop. *See id.* at 106. He opened the door to their apartment to get his brother inside. *Id.* But that effort simply allowed the group into Mr. Saez's apartment, where they continued to assault him. *See id.* at 106-07. Mr. Dice then fired his gun (like a warning shot) and heard someone in the crowd yell. *See id.* at 107-08, 122. The shot had grazed Hernandez's left shoulder. *See id.* at 161-62, 193, 228, 241. The group scattered. But then Mr. Dice heard the door to Apartment D open and close. *See id.* at 108-09. Mr. Saez remained near his apartment's threshold. *See id.* A minute or two later, Hernandez could be heard coming out of Apartment D. He was wearing a two-toned pink and black shirt with black writing (Hollister) across the chest, and he was favoring his left shoulder. *See id.* at 194-95, 345, 352, 368. He then pointed a 9mm firearm at Mr. Saez, prompting a neighbor, Thomas Packard, to yell "hey, no." *See id.* at 198. Hernandez stared at Mr. Packard. *Id.* But that wasn't enough to stop Hernandez from shooting Mr. Saez in the chest. *See id.* at 109, 198.

Mr. Dice managed to pull his brother into their apartment. They then began scrambling up the steps with Mr. Saez's back toward the door and Mr. Dice facing him and supporting him. *See* (N.T. at 110-13). But Hernandez hadn't finished. Through the glass storm door he fired several more shots, two of them struck Mr. Saez—one entered his back, paralyzing him, and a second grazed his stomach. *See id.* at 113, 199-200, 207. In self-defense, Mr. Dice shot back but missed. *See id.* at 113-14. Hernandez and the others from

Apartment D fled in a red Jeep Cherokee and a black Kia SUV. *See id.* at 164, 246, 294, 353, 354. Mr. Saez asked his brother to call 911.

Eighteen minutes after receiving the noise complaint, police received a “shots fired” call. (N.T. at 147, 166).

The police investigate the shooting

Arriving at 369 North Harrisburg Street, police found the glass storm door to Apartment C with bullet holes in it—the glass shattered as they entered. (N.T. at 221). They found Mr. Dice at the top of the steps crying hysterically over his brother. *See id.* at 222-23. When the officers examined Mr. Saez, he was alive, but just barely. His breathing was shallow, he was unconscious, and he had no carotid pulse. *See id.* at 226, 235, 239. Emergency medical services personnel attempted to revive Mr. Saez, but without success. *See id.* at 239.

While this was taking place, Hernandez and three others from his Apartment returned to the homicide scene. *See* (N.T. at 165-66, 228-29, 239-40, 350-53). Officers noticed a grazing wound on Hernandez’s left shoulder, asked him to remove his shirt, and summoned emergency services personnel. *See id.* at 229, 241-42. In the black Kia SUV, police observed blood throughout the back seat. *See id.* at 278-79, 354. Hernandez’s two-toned pink and black shirt ended up on the ground, but his girlfriend, Yuri, picked it up. *See id.* at 244-45. When asked what Hernandez had been wearing at the time of the shooting, Yuri showed the officer the pink and black shirt, which the police then seized. *See id.* at 336-37.

Police took Mr. Dice to their station and interviewed him. He was cooperative and his explanation of the events squared with the evidence at the scene, as well as with the accounts of the neighbors in Apartment A, the Packards. Police also interviewed Hernandez. Not surprisingly, he provided an inconsistent account of the evening. While Hernandez admitted that he was the only one wearing a pink and black two-tone shirt, he refused to identify any of the other people who were with him at the time of the shooting. (N.T. at 450, 453, 454). He referred to them as “two Joses” and another person. *Id.* at 453, 454. Initially, Hernandez said that he fled after being shot. *See* (Com. Ex. 41 at 11). But later he admitted to reentering his apartment. *See* (N.T. at 364). He denied having a firearm or access to one but then conceded that his brother had a gun inside their apartment. *See id.* at 364-65.

Eventually, an officer ran a gunshot residue collector over Hernandez's hands. *See id.* at 341-42.

The investigation of the homicide revealed 9mm shells that had *not* been fired from Mr. Dice's gun. (N.T. at 414-15). Likewise, the bullet retrieved from Mr. Saez's spine was not consistent with having been fired from Mr. Dice's gun. *See id.* at 416-17. Although police never found the murder weapon, they recovered 9mm ammunition from Apartment D. *Id.* at 283-84. The 9mm ammunition found in Hernandez's apartment, Winchester, was consistent with certain shell casings recovered outside of Mr. Saez's apartment. *Compare id.* at 254-56, 258 *with id.* at 284. The autopsy of Mr. Saez revealed several things. First, his body had many abrasions and bruises from being punched and kicked. *Id.* at 318-20. The bullet from the gunshot to Mr. Saez's chest went through his sternum, heart, and lung, before exiting through his back, causing about one liter of blood to fill his chest. *See id.* at 321-22. It was fatal. *Id.* at 323. The second bullet entered Mr. Saez's lower back and lodged in his spine, paralyzing him. *See id.* at 323-25. It too would have been fatal. *Id.* at 326. The forensic pathologist recovered this bullet. *Id.* at 324. The last gunshot injury was to Mr. Saez's abdomen. It was a grazing wound, leaving a football-pattern bruise. *See id.* at 319, 326. From Mr. Saez's shirt, the pathologist retrieved part of the bullet's covering or jacket material. *See id.* at 327.

The distinctive two-toned shirt worn by Hernandez was identified by Mr. Saez's neighbor, Mr. Packard, as like the one worn by the person who shot Mr. Saez. (N.T. at 195-96, 198, 201, 345, 352). Melissa Packard described a similar shirt to police. *See id.* at 162. Mr. and Mrs. Packard also identified the person wearing that shirt as favoring his left shoulder. *See id.* at 161, 193-94, 352. And when Hernandez returned to the scene, he was favoring his left shoulder and wearing the distinctive two-toned shirt. *See id.* at 241. Records from the hospital disclosed that Hernandez's blood-alcohol level was .147. *See id.* at 300-01. Finally, the results from the gunshot residue test confirmed that Hernandez had gunpowder residue on the back of his right hand. *See id.* 439-40.

The criminal charges

The Commonwealth charged Hernandez with criminal homicide generally, that is, intentionally, knowingly, recklessly, or negligently causing the death of Mr. Saez. Hernandez was also charged with reckless endangering Mr. Dice. And the Commonwealth charged

Hernandez with being a person who is prohibited from possessing firearms based on his status as an alien who was unlawfully in the United States. At trial, the Commonwealth elected to forego first-degree murder—an intentional killing. See 18 Pa.C.S. § 2502(a). Rather, the Commonwealth proceeded based on third-degree murder—a killing with legal malice. See 18 Pa.C.S. § 2502(c).

The trial

At trial, the Commonwealth relied on the evidence detailed above tying Hernandez to the murder, such as the testimony of Mr. and Mrs. Packard, the distinctive two-toned shirt Hernandez wore, the wound to his left shoulder, and the gunpowder residue on his right hand. See (N.T. at 494-97, 500). The Commonwealth also emphasized the inconsistency of Hernandez’s statements to law enforcement, the ammunition found in his apartment that was consistent with the shells recovered at the scene, and his central connection to the noise complaint. See *id.* 475-84, 487-88.

For his part, Hernandez did not present any testimony. Instead, the defense pointed to inconsistencies in the witness statements following the murder, (N.T. at 467-71), the large number of people involved in the initial altercation, see *id.* at 461-62, and the lack of a murder weapon. The defense also sought to cast Hernandez’s statements as consistent with cooperation and innocence. See *id.* at 462-63. And the defense argued that the police did not adequately investigate the case. See *id.* 460, 465-66.

The jury found otherwise, returning verdicts of guilty on all three counts.

Discussion

The sufficiency of the evidence

In his sufficiency challenge, Hernandez does not identify any specific offense elements that he views as lacking proof. Rather, he claims that: 1) the police prematurely ended their investigation; 2) Mr. Packard’s testimony was unreliable; 3) Hernandez did not match the description of the aggressor; 4) no physical evidence linked him to the shooting; 5) his grazing left shoulder wound made it impossible for him to fire a gun; 6) and others present at the scene were “more likely candidates” to have committed the offense. (Defendant’s Statement of Errors Complained of on Appeal at ¶ 2).

Putting aside that most of these allegations have nothing to do with evidentiary sufficiency, we will assume that Hernandez is challenging the proof linking him to the murder

and related offenses. As for our review, the central inquiry is not whether this Court believes that the evidence at trial established guilt beyond a reasonable doubt. See *Commonwealth v. Ratsamy*, 934 A.2d 1233, 1235-36 (Pa. 2007) (citing *Jackson v. Virginia*, 443 U.S. 307, 318-19 (1979)). Instead, this Court determines “whether the evidence believed by the fact-finder was sufficient to support the verdict.” *Id.* at 1236. This undertaking requires that a court “view the evidence in the light most favorable to the verdict winner giving the prosecution the benefit of all reasonable inferences to be drawn from the evidence.” *Commonwealth v. Widmer*, 744 A.2d 745, 751 (Pa. 2000) (citing *Commonwealth v. Chambers*, 599 A.2d 630 (Pa. 1991)). And “circumstantial evidence alone can be sufficient to prove every element of an offense.” *Commonwealth v. Cooper*, 941 A.2d 655, 662 (Pa. 2007) (citing *Commonwealth v. Gorby*, 588 A.2d 902, 906 (Pa. 1991)).

Before discussing Hernandez’s argument, we pause to address the pivotal element of third-degree murder—legal malice. In this case, shooting an unarmed man in the chest and then proceeding to fire additional shots at him as he attempted to flee inside his home more than adequately satisfies the “wickedness of disposition, hardness of heart, cruelty, recklessness of consequences, and a mind regardless of social duty” definition of malice. See *Commonwealth v. Packer*, 168 A.3d 161, 168 (Pa. 2017) (quoting *Commonwealth v. Drum*, 58 Pa. 9, 15 (1868)).¹

Turning to Hernandez’s identification argument, while no one could positively describe his physical characteristics, there was plenty of evidence connecting him to the murder. On this point, we borrow from our above recitation of the evidence. First, he committed the crime in front of an eyewitness, Mr. Packard, who identified the distinctive two-toned shirt worn by Hernandez, and observed, accurately, that he had problems with his left shoulder. Second, Mrs. Packard provided a similar description of the perpetrator. Third, Hernandez returned to the scene of the murder wearing a shirt like the one described

¹ Parenthetically, had the Commonwealth proceeded with a first-degree murder prosecution, it could have proven the requisite “specific intent to kill” solely through circumstantial evidence, such as, Hernandez’s use of a deadly weapon upon a vital part of Mr. Saez’s body. See *Commonwealth v. Blakeney*, 946 A.2d 645, 651-52 (Pa. 2008) (citing *Commonwealth v. Rivera*, 773 A.2d 131, 135 (Pa. 2001)). Moreover, specific intent to kill can be formed in a “fraction of a second.” *Commonwealth v. Jordan*, 65 A.3d 318, 323 (Pa. 2013) (citations omitted).

by the Packards, favoring his left shoulder, and admitting that he was the only person so dressed at the time of the shooting. Fourth, he provided inconsistent accounts of his actions to the police and, given the history of noise complaints and the grazing injury to his shoulder from Mr. Dice's shot, Hernandez had motive. Fifth, the positive gunshot residue test linked him to a firearm. Sixth, Hernandez admitted that there was a firearm in his apartment and police found ammunition in his residence consistent with certain shell casings recovered outside Mr. Saez's apartment. Finally, fleeing the scene, disposing of the murder weapon, and refusing to identify those with him reflect consciousness of guilt.²

In sum, the jury's verdicts have a more than adequate evidentiary foundation, and we cannot identify a basis for disturbing them.

The weight of the evidence

For his contention that the jury's verdicts were against the weight of the evidence, Hernandez reiterates the same argument he made for his sufficiency claim. See (Defendant's Statement of Errors Complained of on Appeal at ¶ 4). While Hernandez conflates the sufficiency and weight of the evidence review standards, we will ignore this misconception.

A motion for a new trial based on grounds that the jury's "verdict is contrary to the weight of the evidence, *concedes* that there is sufficient evidence to sustain the verdict." *Widmer*, 744 A.2d at 751 (citation omitted) (emphasis added). The challenge is thus addressed to the discretion of the trial court. See *Commonwealth v. Brown*, 648 A.2d 1177, 1189 (Pa. 1994). In exercising this discretion, a judge should not grant a new trial merely because the testimony conflicted, or because the judge on the same facts would have arrived at a different conclusion. See *Thompson v. City of Philadelphia*, 493 A.2d 669, 672 (Pa. 1985). "[A] new trial should be awarded when the jury's verdict is so contrary to the evidence as to shock one's sense of justice[, making] . . . the award of a new trial is imperative so that right may be given another opportunity to prevail." *Id.* (citation omitted).

At the end of the day, "the jury is the ultimate fact-finder and the sole arbiter of the credibility of each of the witnesses." *Commonwealth v. Clemons*, 200 A.3d 441, 464

² As for Hernandez's claim that he could not have fired a gun with his right hand because of the grazing wound on his left shoulder—that's preposterous.

(Pa. 2019). “Issues of witness credibility include questions of inconsistent testimony and improper motive.” *Id.* A jury is entitled to resolve any inconsistencies in the Commonwealth's evidence in the manner that it sees fit. *Id.*; accord *Commonwealth v. Rivera*, 983 A.2d 1211, 1220 (Pa. 2009) (citation omitted) (stating that “the trier of fact, in passing upon the credibility of witnesses, is free to believe all, part, or none of the evidence”).

Here, there was some inconsistency in the eyewitness descriptions of the shirt worn by Hernandez. And, as noted above, the witnesses could not provide a description of Hernandez's physical characteristics. But, contrary to Hernandez's assertion, though there were many individuals at the scene during the physical assault on Mr. Saez, only one retrieved a firearm, loaded it, returned outside, pointed it at Mr. Saez's chest, and repeatedly pulled the trigger. And it was that individual, Hernandez, who matched the descriptions from the eyewitnesses, who had a motive, and who had gunshot residue on the hand used to shoot Mr. Saez.

In our view, therefore, the verdict against Hernandez was not contradicted by incontrovertible facts, contrary to human experience and the laws of nature, or based on mere conjecture. See *Commonwealth v. Thompson*, 648 A.2d 315, 324-25 (Pa. 1994) (citation omitted).

The reasonableness of the sentence

On his sentencing claim, Hernandez asserts error based on this Court's decision to impose the maximum penalty given Hernandez's lack of criminal history, his statement to this Court, and the absence of intent or malice. See (Defendant's Statement of Errors Complained of on Appeal at ¶ 6).

In general, imposing a sentence is vested in the discretion of the sentencing court and will not be disturbed absent a manifest abuse of such discretion. See *Commonwealth v. Plank*, 445 A.2d 491, 492 (Pa. 1982). An abuse of discretion is more than just an error in judgment; rather, the record must disclose that the judgment exercised was manifestly unreasonable, or the result of partiality, prejudice, bias, or ill-will. See *Commonwealth v. Lane*, 424 A.2d 1325, 1328 (Pa. 1981) (citations omitted).

This is not a circumstance where we erroneously applied the Sentencing Guidelines, where application of the Guidelines was clearly unreasonable, or where we imposed a sentence outside the prescribed range. See 42 Pa.C.S. § 9781(c)(1)-(3). Here,

the guideline range for third-degree murder was 90 to 240 months. See (Guideline Sentence Form at 4). Our sentence was within that range, albeit at the top-end. Nor did this Court ignore the nature and circumstances of the offense, the character and background of Hernandez, or the Sentencing Guidelines. See *id.* at § 9781(d)(1)-(4).

For example, this Court addressed in detail the circumstances attending the murder. See (N.T. Sent. at 25, 26-27). And we discussed Hernandez's background and character. See *id.* at 25-26. This Court also considered the Sentencing Guidelines and balanced the potential punishment and rehabilitative goals. See *id.* 27-28. To illustrate, although we imposed a 20-to-40-year term on the murder count, we ordered concurrent sentences on the remaining counts. While the 20-year-minimum was at the top-end of the suggested range, as we explained at sentencing and as reflected above, Hernandez essentially executed an unarmed man and then continued to shoot him. Such conduct could well have supported a first-degree murder conviction with a life sentence. See *supra* note 1. The evidence presented at trial thus flatly contradicts Hernandez's assertion that he possessed neither intent nor malice. That said, we recognized and accepted the reasons for the Commonwealth's charging decision. See *id.* at 27. In any event, there was nothing mitigating about Hernandez's conduct.

For these reasons, Hernandez's judgment of sentence should be affirmed.
