OPINION & ORDER

LESKINEN, J. November 21, 2022

Before the Court is Defendant's Motion to Transfer Case from Criminal Court to Juvenile Court.

BACKGROUND

Defendant was charged with criminal homicide. The crime was allegedly committed by Defendant on July 19, 2021.

Defendant is currently 16 years old, and his date of birth is April 29, 2006; thus the alleged crime with which Defendant is charged took place while he was a minor, aged 15 years, three months.

Defendant filed his Petition to Transfer Proceedings to Juvenile Court on September 6, 2021, and the hearing was held on October 26, 2022.

DISCUSSION

"When a juvenile seeks to have his case transferred from the criminal division to the juvenile division, he must show that he is in need of and amenable to treatment, supervision or rehabilitation in the juvenile system." Commonwealth v. Johnson, 669 A.2d 315, at 321 (Pa. 1995).

The defense presented evidence consisting of the stipulated to evaluation by Dr. Bruce Wright. While the Commonwealth focused on the limitations of the report in objecting to the transfer, it presented no contradictory testimony, and there was, of course, no cross-examination of the written report.

The standard the Court must consider in this case is the statutory standard set forth at 42 Pa.C.S. § 6355. Following the factors set forth in that statute, the Court hereby finds as facts:

- 1. Gaydos was more than fourteen years of age at the time of the alleged conduct.
- 2. A hearing was held in conformity with the statute.
- 3. Notice was given to his parents.
- 4. The impact on the victim was death, with the consequent severe emotional shock to the victim's family and friends.
- 5. The impact of the alleged offense on the community is severe, in that it involved the death of another young person, aged 18.
- 6. There is limited information about the circumstances of the offense. The defendant and the victim had spent most of the evening socially together with a female who was the girlfriend of the defendant. There was some type of disagreement. The victim left the home on foot. The defendant is said to have been "agitated" and he was given a quad ride to the location where the victim had walked, thus arguably continuing the quarrel. There was some animated discussion, at which time the victim punched the defendant, and thus was the first aggressor. The punch knocked the defendant to the ground. The fight continued with more blows landed by both. However, the defendant is the person who used a knife in what otherwise would have been just a fistfight. There was no other evidence presented to suggest that the defendant would be a threat to the safety of the community or any other identified individual.
- 7. The degree of the child's culpability is disputed, with a substantial likelihood of a conviction of voluntary manslaughter based on a theory of imperfect self-defense, a lesser likelihood of a conviction of third-degree murder, and a possible acquittal on the basis of self-defense. First degree murder and involuntary manslaughter are unlikely based on the evidence presented to the Court. There was a single stab wound to the upper-left chest that ultimately caused the victim's death. The victim was older and taller (6'1") than the defendant. The prior history of the relationship between the defendant and the victim, the exact amount of force with which the defendant was presented, and the defendant's prior experience with the use of a knife are all factors that are not well-developed at this point, despite the sole eyewitness other than the defendant having been thoroughly interrogated at the Preliminary Hearing.
- 8. If the defendant is convicted as an adult, standard guidelines for third-degree murder would suggest a sentence of from six to twelve years up to twenty to forty years. The circumstances known at this point suggest the sentence would likely be at the lower end of that range. Standard guidelines for voluntary manslaughter would suggest a minimum of three to four and one-half years. Mitigated range sentences based on the defendant's youth could reduce the minimum sentences cited by twelve months. Defendant was in secure detention from the date of the offense until his bond was reduced on March 21, 2022, so he has about eight months of time credit. Since that time, he has been restricted to home detention. If treated as a juvenile, it would appear that the defendant could be held in secure detention as a juvenile until his twenty-first birthday, when he would be released without any restrictions. The restrictions on his free movement in the juvenile system for five years and nine months would be comparable to the minimum length of incarceration he would likely receive if convicted of third-degree murder as an adult, and comparable to the maximum sentence he would likely receive if convicted of voluntary manslaughter.
- 9. The possibility of parole supervision beyond the defendant's 21st birthday is the principal potential positive to retaining the defendant in the adult system. While he would be supervised for a longer period, there is little reason to believe the defendant would survive a substantial term of incarceration with a positive personal outcome, and it is entirely likely that he would be a greater danger to the community at that time.

10. The defendant was expelled from school in the seventh grade because he pulled the hair of a female, allegedly after she did the same to him. He was cited as having an emotional disturbance; including anger management issues, attention deficit disorder and depression; but he had no record of juvenile offenses before the instant arrest. He did abuse marijuana but stopped nine months prior to this incident. He did consume alcohol, primarily beer. He was briefly committed to a mental hospital after threatening suicide. He has fathered a child. His parents are divorced, his father lives in Missouri, and his mother recently divorced his stepfather, so he had no male role model, positive or negative, in his home at the time of this incident. He was scheduled to return to regular classes in the fall of 2021. While held without bond, the defendant was detained at the Aspire juvenile detention center, where he reportedly did very well. He has had no behavior problems since returning to his mother's home in March. Gaydos' age and mental capacity suggest that he should be amenable to juvenile treatment.

Pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 6355, the burden of proof is on the defense since Gaydos used a deadly weapon and was over the age of fourteen, and because he is charged with criminal homicide. Therefore, the defense must establish, by a preponderance of the evidence, that transferring this case to the juvenile court: "serves the public interest and that the child is amenable to treatment, supervision or rehabilitation as a juvenile."

Dr. Bruce Wright's report indicated the following additional information:

- 1. The defendant can effectively participate in treatment and rehabilitation if he chooses to do so.
- 2. Defendant is still immature.
- 3. This was not a criminally sophisticated offense.
- 4. Defendant has no prior record.
- 5. No previous attempts have been made to rehabilitate the defendant.
- 6. Defendant will not turn 21 years of age until April 29, 2027.
- 7. No prior criminal/legal history.
- 8. Defendant's behavior has been controlled in the sixteen months since the incident.
- 9. Defendant's psychiatric diagnosis has been responsive to treatment, but defendant has been noncompliant with treatment and is not interested in returning to therapy.
- 10. Defendant has abstained from alcohol since this incident and from marijuana for more than two years, but recurrence of abuse would adversely affect his prognosis.

Dr. Wright concludes that the positive factors outweigh the negative factors, and that defendant can be effectively treated in the juvenile justice system "as long as he complies with treatment recommendations....." The available evidence thus shows that Defendant is a youth who is likely to benefit from the special features and programs of the juvenile system.

Of equal importance under the statute, however, is the public interest. The Commonwealth is on record as opposing the requested transfer. That said, the Commonwealth presented no independent evidence to counter the opinion of Dr. Bruce Wright, who was the psychiatrist both sides agreed to use. The Court notes that the defendant's conduct in using a knife on his friend was excessively aggressive and irrational, but that a jury could conclude that it was justifiable self-defense. Even if the defendant is guilty of homicide, however, persons convicted of homicide are the least likely to recidivate.

Considering all of the facts and circumstances, the Court concludes that it would be in the public interest to see this young man rehabilitated and set on course for a conventionally successful life, and it is reasonable to hope for such an outcome based on the evidence actually presented.

For all of these reasons, the Court hereby enters the following:

ORDER

AND NOW, this 21st day of November, 2022, upon consideration of Defendant's Petition to Transfer to Juvenile Court; the Court hereby finds that the defense has carried its burden of proof. The Court therefore holds that defendant's case should be TRANSFERRED to the jurisdiction of the Juvenile Court. The defendant's Motion to Transfer Case from Criminal Court to Juvenile Court is therefore GRANTED.

It is further ORDERED that the defendant's current bond remain in effect, together with all terms and conditions thereof pending an adjudication and dispositional hearing before the Juvenile Court.
