OPINION AND ORDER

Wagner, P.J. July 24, 2020

Before the Court is the Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment. The Defendant asserts that the Plaintiffs action should be dismissed as a matter of law as the Plaintiff's claim fails to state a claim upon which relief can be granted as the actions of the employee do not fall within any exceptions to sovereign immunity.

FACTS

The Plaintiff, Jeffrey Marten is an incarcerated person serving a sentence at the State Correctional Institution at Fayette (hereinafter "SCI-Fayette"). The Defendant, Thomas Anthony Williams, is a Corrections Commissary Supervisor employed at SCI-Fayette. The Plaintiff asserts that on July 25, 2019, he was to receive two bags of commissary items. The items contained in the bags of commissary items that he did receive did not contain the items he had ordered. Ultimately, it was determined that the items contained in the bags were ordered by another inmate and were eventually turned over to that other inmate. The Plaintiffs alleges that he received some of his ordered items, however, a second bag containing other items which the Plaintiff ordered were retained by the Defendant. The Plaintiff alleges that the Defendant would not turn over the other items to him. Plaintiff asserts that the items in the second bag that the

Defendant refused to tum over to him contained items totaling Nineteen Dollars and Eighty-Four Cents (\$19.84). The Plaintiff alleges that the Defendant never gave him the items located in the second bag or reimbursed him for those items. The Plaintiff asserts that the Defendant was negligent and breached his duty of care in failing to tum over the items or compensate him for their value.

In response, the Defendant filed an Answer denying that he was negligent at any time and denies that the Plaintiff is entitled to any relief. The Defendant filed New Matter alleging that the Plaintiff fails to state a claim on which relief can be granted as his action is barred by the Doctrine of Sovereign Immunity. He asserts that the action is not within any of the permitted exceptions to immunity.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The Plaintiff filed his prose civil complaint on November 21, 2019. Thereafter, on January 9, 2020, the Defendant, represented by the Office of the Attorney General filed an Answer and New Matter. The Plaintiff filed a Reply to the New Matter on January 29, 2020. On June 29, 2020, the Defendant filed a Motion for Summary Judgment claiming that the Plaintiff has failed to state a claim on which relief can be granted. Plaintiff filed a response in which he asserts that the Defendant breached his duty to deliver the entire commissary order.

DISCUSSION

Pennsylvania Rule of Civil Procedure 1035 provides that summary judgment may be rendered if the record shows that there is no genuine issue as to any material fact. A Motion for Summary Judgment is a means to eliminate the waste of time and resources of both litigants and the courts in cases where a trial would be a useless formality. The party moving for summary judgment has the burden of demonstrating that no genuine issue of material fact exists and that he is entitled to judgment as a matter of law. In deciding a motion for summary judgment, the record must be viewed in a light most favorable to the non-moving party and may only be entered where the right is clear and free from doubt.

Defendant's motion for summary judgment is premised on the argument that the Plaintiff has failed to raise a claim on which relief may be granted. The Plaintiff is an inmate incarcerated in a state correctional facility who ordered a significant number of food items from the commissary. Initially, an error was made and the Plaintiff received items from another inmate's order. The Defendant asserts that he received most of his items but contends that his other items were in another bag which the Defendant would not tum over to him. He states in his Response to Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment (hereinafter "Response") that the Defendant did not provide the Plaintiff with the remainder of the Plaintiffs commissary items and further asserts that "those commissary items were never in plaintiffs possession at any time period when the defendant received them from the PCI on July 19, 2019." (Response Paragraph 15). The Plaintiffs assertion that he never possessed the items clashes with his assertion that the Defendant took possession of the Defendant's property.

On July 25, 2019, the Plaintiff was given items marked for him but were not the ones he had ordered. That problem was corrected and the items he initially received were turned over to another inmate who had ordered those items. The Defendant turned over some of the items on the Plaintiffs request list but did not turn over other items. The Plaintiff asserts that those items were in a second bag and the Defendant refused to give those items to the Plaintiff on that day or at any later time. He asserts that the Defendant took sole possession of the bag containing two bags of Wise Regular Potato Chips, five bags of Whole Enchilada Party Mix, five bags of Whole Shabang Potato Chips and three bags of nacho Cheese Tortilla Chips with a value of Nineteen Dollars and Eighty-Four Cents. (\$19.84). (Complaint).

The Defendant raises the issue of sovereign immunity. As a Prison Commissary Officer, it is apparent that the Defendant meets the definition of a person who acts on

behalf of a commonwealth party, a state correctional facility, as he is compensated and employed by that agency. 42 Pa. C.S. § 8501. The doctrine of sovereign immunity states that it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Commonwealth, and its officials and employees acting within the scope of their duties, shall continue to enjoy sovereign immunity and official immunity and remain immune from suit except as the General Assembly shall specifically waive the immunity. 1 Pa. C.S.A. § 2310. The General Assembly waives immunity in the specific instances detailed in 42 Pa. C.S.A. § 8522(b) for negligent acts. 42 Pa. C.S.A. § 8522(a). The Plaintiff has asserted that his claim falls under the exception related to the care, custody or control of personal property which states:

The care, custody or control of personal property in the possession or control of Commonwealth parties, including Commonwealth-owned personal property and property of persons held by a Commonwealth agency...

42 Pa. C.S.A. §8522(b)(3),

Under Pennsylvania law, there are two ways to overcome sovereign immunity, first, sovereign immunity is waived by statute in nine specific areas; and second, sovereign immunity does not protect employees acting outside the course and scope of their employment. Sarin v. Magee, 333 F.Supp.3d 473(2018).

The Plaintiff asserts that the Defendant acted negligently when he took the bag of Plaintiffs food items and retained sole possession of those items. (Complaint Paragraph 12). He attempts to demonstrate that the actions of this officer comes under an exception to the doctrine of sovereign immunity in that the "Defendant assumed direct care, custody, and control over plaintiffs purchased commissary items." (Complaint Paragraph 15). While the Plaintiff has asserted that these items were taken into the sole custody of this prison officer, he has failed to establish that these items ever were his personal property. In his reply, the Plaintiff asserts that he never possessed these items after he ordered the m. (Response, Paragraph 15). While the Plaintiff ordered items, he has failed to establish that these particular food items ever became his personal property.

Additionally, Plaintiffs allegations against the Defendant do not constitute negligence. It is apparent that he is raising a claim of conversion when he asserts that the Defendant took the items into his sole possession and never turned them over to the Plaintiff. While the Defendant has denied that he ever took the Plaintiffs items, the act of conversion is an intentional tort not covered by the exceptions to sovereign immunity. The Pennsylvania Supreme Court has defined the intentional tort of conversion as "an act of willful interference with a chattel, done without lawful justification, by which any person entitled thereto is deprived of use and possession. Norriton Wast Realty Corp v. Central-Penn National Bank. 254 A.2d 637 (Pa. 1969), quoted in Price v. Simcox, 207 WL 4287870 (Pa. Cmwlth. September, 2017).

Employees of the Commonwealth are protected by sovereign immunity from liability for actions arising from intentional tort claims provided they acted within the scope of their duties. If an action for intentional misconduct occurred, relief is barred by sovereign immunity if the Commonwealth employee was within the scope of his duties. Williams v. Strickman, 917 A.2d 915, 917 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2006).

The Plaintiff has presented no evidence that the Defendant acted outside the scope of his duties. He has alleged, without providing any evidentiary support, that the Defendant acted outside the scope of his employment. Clearly as a commissary officer, he was acting in the course of his employment when he distributed commissary orders and adjusted orders.

Plaintiff's claim that the Defendant acted purposely when he confiscated and took sole possession of the bag of commissary items is clearly a claim of intentional misconduct. Plaintiff has failed to raise a claim on which relief can be granted. For the reasons stated, the Plaintiff has failed to establish that he had a property interest in the items in the second bag or that the Defendant acted in a negligent manner. Therefore, the Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment must be granted in accordance with the preceding Opinion.

ORDER

AND NOW, this 24th day of July 2020, after full consideration of the record, the pertinent statutes and the arguments of the parties, it is hereby ORDERED and DECREED that the Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment is hereby granted and the Plaintiffs action is dismissed.
