OPINION AND ORDER

MEHALOV, J.

March 24, 2025

Following a trial by jury on December 2nd through December 5th, 2024, Appellant, Joseph Thomas, was convicted of Murder in the First Degree {1}, On December 13th, 2024, Appellant was sentenced on his conviction for Murder in the First Degree to a term of imprisonment for Life. Appellant filed his own pro se Post- Sentence Motion. As Appellant is represented by Court-Appointed Counsel, and has no right to hybrid representation, this Motion was forwarded to the attention of Counsel. Subsequently Appellant, by and through Counsel, filed an appeal with the Pennsylvania Superior Court. This Opinion is in support of the verdict of the jury and the sentencing order

CONCISE ISSUES

Appellant filed the following Statement of Errors Complained of on Appeal:

1. Whether the Trial Court committed an error of law and/or abused its discretion by way of admitting a certain exhibit marked as the "Commonwealth's Exhibit 'XX"', in the nature of a photograph depicting the deceased victim's corpse laying in a pool of blood and wearing a bloody sweatshirt, as the said Exhibit's prejudicial and inflammatory effect on the jury outweighed its probative value?

2. Whether the Trail Court committed an error of law and/or abused its discretion by way of admitting a certain exhibit marked as "Commonwealth's Exhibit 'XXII"", in the nature of a photograph taken at the autopsy of the deceased victim, and depicting the victim's corpse as well as a close view of entry and exit wounds thereon, as the said Exhibit's prejudicial and inflammatory effect on the jury outweighed its probative value?

3. Whether the Commonwealth failed to present sufficient evidence to prove the elements of the offense of Criminal Homicide beyond a reasonable doubt?

4. Whether the Jury's verdict was against the weight of the evidence?

FACTS

On November 21st, 2020, Lieutenant Mike Iwin, then a Seargent, was involved in a homicide investigation. Lieutenant Irwin was the supervising officer at the crime scene. The Victim at this crime scene was identified as Megan Massey. (T.T. pgs. 134-135). Appellant, Joseph Michael Thomas, Jr. was identified as a potential suspect and was interrogated by the Pennsylvania State Police. (T.T. pg. 135). This interview was played on the record and marked as Commonwealth's Exhibit 28. (T.T. pgs. 145-150). The recording of the interview was not transcribed. Subsequently, Appellant was arrested and charged with the Homicide of Megan Massey and related offenses. The additional charges were withdrawn prior to trial, leaving only the charge of Murder in the Frist Degree to stand.

DISCUSSION

The first two issues raised by Appellant go to the admissibility of evidence at trial. As such, we will discuss both collectively. It is long established law that the admissibility of evidence at trial is in the sound discretion of the trial court. This question of admissibility will be given great deference on appeal unless it is shown that the trial court manifestly abused its discretion by an error of law. Commonwealth v. Carter, 443 Pa. Super. 231, 238, 661 A.2d 390, 393 (1995). Pursuant to Commonwealth v. McGowan, 525 Pa. 292, 295, 635, A.2d 113, 115 (1993), evidence must be relevant to the case at hand to be admissible. Relevant evidence is that which tends to make a material fact more or less probable. Commonwealth v. Simmons, 541 Pa. 211, 243, 662 A.2d 621, 637 (1995). Appellant alleges that certain evidence admitted containing pictures of the corpse of the victim and photographs of the autopsy of the victim were more prejudicial than probative. However, due to the nature of the charge of Murder in the First Degree, the production of a dead body is an essential element of the crime. As such, the admission of such evidence is substantially probative of the issue at hand. The witness(es) by which said evidence was admitted were present in Court to authenticate the same. These witness(es) were also subject to cross examination by counsel for Appellant. Thus, this evidence was properly admitted within the discretion of the trial court.

Next, Appellant asserts that the Commonwealth failed to present sufficient evidence to prove the elements of the offense of Criminal Homicide beyond a reasonable doubt. When Sufficiency of the Evidence presented at trial is raised as an issue on appeal, the applicable standard is as follows:

The standard of review for a challenge to the sufficiency of the evidence is to determine whether, when viewed in a light most favorable to the verdict winner, the evidence at trial and all reasonable inferences therefrom is sufficient for the trier of fact to find that each element of the crimes charged is established beyond a reasonable doubt. The Commonwealth may sustain its burden of proving every element beyond a reasonable doubt by means of wholly circumstantial evidence.

The facts and circumstances established by the Commonwealth need not preclude every possibility of innocence. Any doubt raised as to the accused's guilt is to be resolved by the fact-finder. [In this context, appellate courts] do not assess credibility nor ... assign weight to any of the testimony of record. Therefore, [the verdict will not be disturbed] unless the evidence is so weak and inconclusive that as a matter of law no probability of fact may be drawn from the combined circumstances.

Commonwealth v. Vogelsang, 90 A.3d 717, 719 (Pa. Super. 2014). In the case at bar, the Jury heard all testimony and evidence presented at the time of trial. It is well established in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania that "the weight of the evidence is exclusively for the finder of fact, who is free to believe all, none, or some of the evidence and to determine the credibility of witnesses." Commonwealth v. Johnson, 668 A. 2d 97, 101 (Pa. 1995). Thus, the verdict of the jury should not be disturbed in the absence of evidence so weak and inconclusive that there is no probable way the conclusion could be drawn. In this case, the evidence produced at trial far exceeded this mm1mum standard. Additionally, in Commonwealth v. Heckler, 153 A.3d 1005, 1008 (Pa. Super. 2016), the Superior Court advances the proposition that "[n]evertheless, the Commonwealth need not establish guilt to a mathematically certainty. Any doubt about the defendant's guilt is to be resolved by the fact finder unless the evidence is so weak and inconclusive that, as a matter of law, no probability of fact can be drawn from the combined circumstances." Id. (citation omitted).

The guidance from Heckler, supra, also reminds this Court that the Commonwealth may sustain its burden by means of wholly circumstantial evidence. Id. Moreover, the Superior Court further held, "significantly, we may not substitute our judgment for that of the fact finder; so long as the evidence adduced, accepted in the light most favorable to the Commonwealth. demonstrates the respective elements of a defendant's crimes beyond a reasonable doubt. the appellant's conviction [] will be upheld." Id. (emphasis added) (citation omitted).

The final issue presented by Appellant avers that the verdict of the Jury is against the weight of the evidence. Under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure, we are given clear and concise guidance to the issue of weight of the evidence. Pa. R. Crim. P. 607 (A)(l)-(3) states that "...{A} claim that the verdict was against the weight of the evidence shall be raised with the trial judge in a Motion for a New Trial:

1) Orally, on the record, at any time prior to sentencing;

2) By written Motion at any time prior to sentencing;

3) Or in a Post-Sentence Motion.

However, Pursuant to Commonwealth v. Weir, 201 A.3d 163, 167 (Pa. Super. 2018), "... {An} Appellant's failure to avail himself of any of the prescribed methods for presenting a weight of the evidence issue to the trial court constitutes a waiver of that claim". Id. Because Appellant waited until the time of Appeal to raise the issue of ver-

dict against the weight of the evidence, Appellant has effectively waived this issue. However, even if the issue were deemed not to be waived, the issue would fail on its merits. "...{A} new trial should only be granted if the verdict is so contrary to the evidence so as to the shock the conscience and sense of justice". Commonwealth v. Widmer, 744 A.2d 745 (Pa. 2000). As outlined above, it is reasonable that a finder of fact could reach this verdict based upon the evidence presented at trial.

Accordingly, this appeal lacks merit.
