

OPINION AND ORDER

LESKINEN, J.

November 8, 2022

Before the Court is the Defendant's Omnibus Pre-trial Motion in the form of a Motion To Suppress an oral statement and a Motion To Suppress a written statement. After a careful review of the record and applicable case law, the Court hereby issues the following Opinion and Order:

Factual Background

An Omnibus Pre-Trial Hearing was held in this matter on October 19th, 2022. The Commonwealth presented the testimony of Pennsylvania State Trooper Robert Wilson. Trooper Wilson testified that on April 27th, 2021, he was working on the second floor of the Pennsylvania State Police Barracks in Uniontown when he was summoned by his dispatcher to come downstairs to the first floor lobby to speak with an individual who had walked into the Barracks and had asked to speak to someone. Trooper Wilson arrived on the first floor accompanied by Trooper Justin Handlin, where they made contact with the individual: the Defendant, Eugene Kasiewicz. Trooper Wilson testified that he, Trooper Handlin, and the Defendant walked from the lobby to an interview room. Trooper Wilson testified that at this time he did not know who the Defendant was or why he was there. Trooper Wilson testified that he thought that the Defendant might have been the victim of a crime.

Trooper Wilson testified that he asked the Defendant why he was there. The Commonwealth submitted the DVD video recording of the interview. The recording depicts the Defendant giving Troopers Wilson and Handlin information about his living situation. It is unclear in the beginning whether the Defendant is reporting a crime or confessing to one. Troopers Wilson and Handlin asked the Defendant to clarify and the Defendant volunteers, "I assaulted him," "I had his prick in my mouth" (referring to a child).

Troopers Wilson and Handlin provided the Defendant with a standard NONCUS-TODIAL WRITTEN STATEMENT form to write on. The Defendant chose to use the NONCUSTODIAL WRITTEN STATEMENT form. Trooper Wilson testified that he and Trooper Handlin told the Defendant that he was not under arrest. Troopers Wilson and Handlin then left the room. Trooper Wilson testified that he left the door unlocked.

The Commonwealth submitted a copy of the Defendant's NONCUSTODIAL WRITTEN STATEMENT form. The form includes the following questions before the blank lines for the "Narrative" portion; the questions are followed by check marks:

1. Do you understand that you are NOT IN CUSTODY, are free to leave at any time, and that the statement you wish to provide is completely voluntary?

2. Do you now wish to make a formal statement?

3. Are you able to read and write the English language?

The Defendant checked "Yes" to all three questions.

The Defendant remained in the room and wrote his statement. When the Defendant finished writing his statement, Troopers Wilson and Handlin did not arrest the Defendant.

Legal Standard, Motions To Suppress

If a person in custody is to be subjected to interrogation, he must first be informed in clear and unequivocal terms that he has the right to remain silent. Miranda v. Arizona, 384 U.S. 436, 467-68, (1966). A custodial interrogation for purposes of Miranda occurs when there is a questioning initiated by the police after a person has been taken into custody or otherwise deprived of his or her freedom of action in any significant way. Com. v. Clinton, 905 A.2d 1026, 1032 (Pa.Super.2006).

The Fourth Amendment protects citizens against unreasonable searches and seizures; a mere encounter need not be supported by any level of suspicion, an investigative detention must be supported by reasonable suspicion, and an arrest must be supported by probable cause. Com. v. Hicks, 208 A.3d 916, 926 (2019). The Pennsylvania Supreme Court summarily articulated the mechanism which distinguishes a mere encounter from an investigative detention in Com. v. Mathis:

In fixing the moment at which a detention has occurred, "the pivotal inquiry is whether, considering all the facts and circumstances evidencing the exercise of force, a reasonable [person] would have thought he was being restrained." Com. v. Mendenhall, 715 A.2d 1117, 1120 (1998) (citing Com. v. Jones, 378 A.2d 835, 840 (1977)); see also United States v. Mendenhall, 446 U.S. 544 (1980) ("[A] person has been 'seized' ... only if, in view of all of the circumstances surrounding the incident, a reasonable person would have believed that he was not free to leave"). In Com. v. Strickler, 757 A.2d 884 (2000), the Court set forth a non-exhaustive list of factors deemed relevant in assessing whether a seizure has occurred: the presence of police excesses; physical contact with the suspect; police direction of the subject's movements; the demeanor of the officer; the location of the confrontation; the manner of expression directed to the citizen; and the content of statements or inter-

rogatories. See id. at 72-73, 757 A.2d at 897- 98 (citations omitted). Strickler cautioned, though, that no single factor dictates the ultimate conclusion as to whether a detention occurred, see id. at 59, 757 A.2d at 890, and this Court has recognized that the line between a mere encounter, which requires no suspicion, and an investigative detention, "cannot be precisely defined 'because of the myriad of daily situations in which police[] and citizens confront each other on the street.' "Mendenhall, 715 A.2d at 1120 (quoting Jones, 474 Pa. at 371,378 A.2d at 839). Ultimately, it is the "nature of the confrontation" that informs the assessment of the totality of the circumstances. Com. v. Lewis, 636 A.2d 619,623 (1994).

Com. v. Mathis, 173 A.3d 699, 712 (2017).

Investigative detentions must be supported by reasonable suspicion. Com. v. Hicks, 208 A.3d 916, 926 (2019). Reasonable suspicion exists only where the officer is able to articulate specific observations which, in conjunction with reasonable inferences derived from those observations, led him reasonably to conclude, in light of his experience, that criminal activity was afoot and that the person he stopped was involved in that activity. Com. v. Chambers, 55 A.3d 1208, 1215 (Pa.Super.2012). The reasonable suspicion standard is less demanding than probable cause, as "reasonable suspicion can be established with information that is different in quantity or content than that required to establish probable cause" and "can arise from information that is less reliable than that required to show probable cause." Com. v. Moore, 805 A.2d 616, 620 (Pa.Super.2002) (quoting Alabama v. White, 496 U.S. 325, 330, (1990)).

Discussion, Motions To Suppress

A custodial interrogation for purposes of Miranda occurs when there is a questioning initiated by the police after a person has been taken into custody or otherwise deprived of his or her freedom of action in any significant way. Com. v. Clinton, 905 A.2d 1026, 1032 (Pa.Super.2006), emphasis added.

The Court finds that the inculpatory statement in this case was initiated by the Defendant, that the Defendant was not in custody, and that the Defendant was not deprived of his freedom of action in any significant way. The Defendant arrived at the Uniontown State Police Barracks of his own free will. Trooper Wilson testified that when he first began interacting with the Defendant, he did not know who the Defendant was or why he was there. Trooper Wilson testified that he even thought that the Defendant might have been the victim of a crime. The Defendant volunteered, "I assaulted him" and "I had his prick in my mouth" (referring to the Child). The Court, viewing of all of the circumstances surrounding the incident, finds that a seizure did not occur, that the Troopers were not required to Mirandize the Defendant, and that the oral statement is fully admissible.

The written statement was made on a standard NONCUSTODIAL WRITTEN STATEMENT form. The Defendant checked the "Yes" box next to "Do you understand that you are NOT IN CUSTODY, are free to leave at any time, and that the statement you wish to provide is completely voluntary?" Trooper Wilson testified that he and Trooper Handlin left the door unlocked. The Court, viewing all of the circumstances surrounding the incident, finds that a seizure did not occur, that the Troopers were not

required to Mirandize the Defendant, and that the written statement is, likewise, admissible.

WHEREFORE, the Court issues the following Order:

ORDER

AND NOW, this 8th day of November, 2022, upon consideration of the Defendant's Omnibus Pre-Trial Motion in the Form of a Motion To Suppress an oral statement and a Motion To Suppress a written statement, the Court concludes that the Defendant was not subject to Miranda at the time that either statement was made, that the Defendant initiated contact with the police, and that both statements were made voluntarily. It is therefore ORDERED and DIRECTED that both the oral statement and the written statement are fully admissible and that the Defendant's Omnibus Pre-Trial Motion is hereby DENIED.

Please be sure to return the form even if you are currently being appointed regularly. Several of the lists have not been updated since 2017!

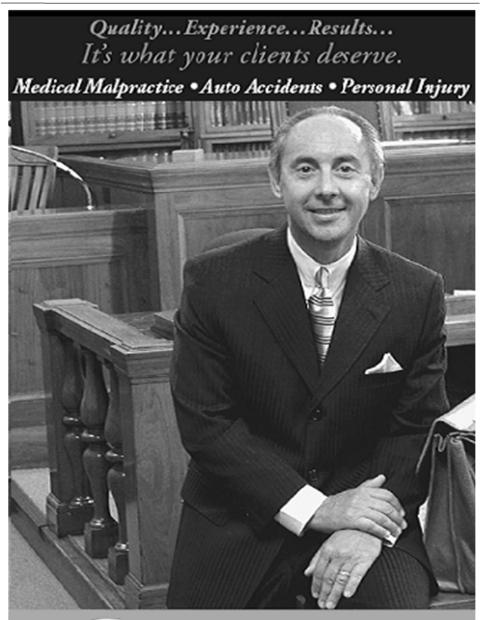
