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comprehensively define the metes and bounds of justifiable burdens on the Second Amendment right, they do, at a minimum, show that disarmament is justified as long as a felon continues to “present a special danger of misus[ing firearms],” *Rahimi*, 602 U.S. at 698, 144 S. Ct. 1889, in other words, when he would likely “pose[] a physical danger to others” if armed, *Range II*, 124 F.4th at 232.

Pitsilides v. Barr, 128 F.4th 203, 210 (3d Cir. 2025). In *Pitsilides*, the Court of Appeals observed that “some offenses may offer conclusive evidence that someone poses such a danger.” *Id.* at 211; *see also United States v. Williams*, 113 F.4th 637, 663 (6th Cir. 2024) (holding that a person convicted of a crime is “dangerous,” and thus can be disarmed, if he has committed “a crime that inherently poses a significant threat of danger”).

In Boone’s case, his prior felony convictions included aggravated assault and robbery. And the possession of the firearm at issue occurred in connection with a murder. Boone therefore presented a special danger of misusing firearms when he possessed the firearm during the offenses of conviction. Boone’s constitutional challenge to the firearms statute thus fails.

III.

Conclusion

For these reasons, this 24 of June 2026, we enter the following:

Boone’s post-sentence motion is **DENIED**.

Civil Action – expungement of mental health commitment and restoration of right to own or possess firearms under Pennsylvania’s Uniform Firearms Act

Section 6111.1(g)(2) of the Firearms Act permits a person involuntarily committed under Section 302 of the Mental Health Procedures Act to petition a court to review the sufficiency of the evidence supporting the commitment. But the scope of this Court’s review is limited to the physician’s findings made at the time of the commitment and the contemporaneous record supporting the commitment.

The psychiatric evaluation prepared as part of the mental health commitment may be reviewed as part of the court’s sufficiency review.

An involuntary mental health commitment under Section 301(b)(2)(i) of the Mental Health Procedures Act, inability to care for oneself, cannot be satisfied based on suicidal ideation.

Section 6105(f)(1) of the Firearms Act allows for the restoration on one's firearms rights if the court determines that the applicant may possess a firearm without risk to the applicant or any other person.

OPINION AND ORDER

"The right to keep and bear arms is among the fundamental rights necessary to our system of ordered liberty." *United States v. Rahimi*, 602 U.S. 680, 690 (2024) (internal quotations and citation omitted). It's enshrined in both the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and in Article I, Section 21 of the Pennsylvania Constitution. Here, we decide two issues. First, whether there was sufficient evidence to forfeit M.S.W.'s right to keep and bear arms based upon a brief and ultimately misguided commitment under Section 302 of the Mental Health Procedures Act, 50 P.S. §7302.¹ In other words, should we expunge that commitment under Section 6111.1(g)(2) of Pennsylvania's Uniform Firearms Act, 18 Pa.C.S. § 6111.1(g)(2). Second, assuming a sufficient foundation for the 302 commitment and thus the forfeiture of M.S.W.'s right to bear arms, whether we should restore that right under Section 6105(f)(1) of the Firearms Act.

I.

Factual background

In November 2023, a Pennsylvania State Trooper observed a vehicle passing a car in an unsafe manner. See (Pennsylvania State Police Ex. "B" at 6) ("PSP Ex. ____"). The trooper followed the vehicle and noticed it turning into a driveway without signaling. See *id.* The driver of the vehicle was M.S.W., who had turned into the driveway of his home. M.S.W.'s eyes appeared to be watery and red. See *id.* And his speech was low and raspy. See *id.* M.S.W. was apologetic, self-deprecating, indifferent, and later uncooperative. See *id.* at 4. He admitted to having consumed alcohol. See *id.* at 6. But he wanted to eat something

¹ M.S.W. did not raise an "as applied" constitutional challenge to the firearms prohibition contained in 18 Pa.C.S. § 6105(c)(4). *C.f., e.g., Keys v. Lynch*, 195 F. Supp. 3d 702 (M.D. Pa. 2016).

quickly because of low blood sugar resulting from his diabetes. See (N.T. 6/29/26 at 21). The trooper, however, arrested M.S.W. for driving under the influence ("DUI").

While in custody, M.S.W. expressed suicidal ideation. See *id.* at 6. But he agreed to have his blood drawn for purposes of measuring his blood alcohol content. The trooper transported M.S.W. to the Hershey Medical Center and completed a mental health commitment form under Section 302 of the Mental Health Procedures Act. On the form, the trooper noted that M.S.W. had been arrested for DUI and had made statements about his life being over and wanting to kill himself. See (PSP Ex. "A" at 5).

A resident physician at the Medical Center noted on the 302-commitment form that M.S.W. had made "[a]ctive suicide statements with no plan, but clear intent." (PSP Ex. "A" at 9). He did not appear to be visibly intoxicated during the examination. *Id.* The physician recommended an inpatient psychiatric assessment. *Id.*

Shortly thereafter, a second doctor, the teaching physician, evaluated M.S.W. (Pet. Ex. "A" at 11-18). She acknowledged M.S.W.'s earlier suicidal ideation to the trooper and the emergency room doctor. But she found him to be oriented in person, time, and place. *Id.* She described his thoughts as logical and noted that he spoke at a normal rate and volume. *Id.* M.S.W. denied any hallucinations or delusions. *Id.* She observed no aggression and found no homicidal ideation. *Id.* M.S.W. acknowledged some depression decades ago but said that he was not under any mental health treatment or taking mental health medications. *Id.* She discerned no confusion or memory impairment. And she described his insight and judgment as impaired "due to being intoxicated." *Id.* More important, she documented that M.S.W. was on an insulin pump. *Id.*² Nevertheless, she concurred with inpatient mental health hospitalization.

About a day and one-half later, a psychiatry resident in the Medical Center's Psychiatric Unit evaluated M.S.W. (Pet. Ex. "A" at 11-18). She confirmed that he had no significant psychiatric history, and that he denied previous or current suicidal ideation. See *id.* at 11. He said that his statements were a result of low blood sugar and that he did not mean them. *Id.* He explained that he had firearms for hunting and could not imagine

² As it turned out, M.S.W. was experiencing hypoglycemia. See (Pet. Ex. "A" at 52).

pointing a gun at a person or himself. See *id.* at 12.³ At the conclusion of her evaluation, she stated that M.S.W. “does not require inpatient psychiatric treatment at this time. [M.S.W.] does not meet the criteria for involuntary evaluation and treatment under the PA Mental Health Procedures Act of 1976, section 7302. Would recommend reversal of 302.” *Id.* at 11-12. The Medical Center’s Chief of Psychiatry agreed. M.S.W. was immediately discharged. The medical records also show that M.S.W.’s glucose at the time of admission was 25 and that he was suffering from hypoglycemia. See *id.* at 20, 149.⁴ And his blood alcohol content was .078, just below the threshold for a driving under the influence offense in Section 3802(a)(2) of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. § 3802(a)(2). See (PSP Ex. “B” at 20). The Commonwealth ultimately elected to forego prosecution for driving under the influence.

II.

Procedural background

In December 2023, the Dauphin County Sheriff advised M.S.W. that his license to carry a firearm permit had been revoked because of his mental health commitment. M.S.W. then filed a “Petition to Restore License to Carry Firearm Permit.” He served the filing on the Dauphin County Sheriff and the Pennsylvania State Police (“PSP”). In its answer, PSP pointed out that the process for challenging the Sheriff’s decision to revoke a license to carry permit differs from that pursued by M.S.W. See, e.g., 18 Pa.C.S. § 6114 & 2 Pa.C.S. § 754. M.S.W. filed an amended petition—still styled as seeking restoration of his license to carry permit—but this time citing the provisions of the Firearms Act that address expungement and restoration of firearm rights.⁵ An involuntary mental health commitment subjects an

³ At certain points, M.S.W. suggested that the suicidal statements were a ruse to avoid going to jail. While this admission gave us some pause, it’s irrelevant to our disposition. The irony of the collateral consequences from the ruse, however, is not lost on the Court.

⁴ A normal glucose range is between 70 and 99.

⁵ The statute governing whether a County Sheriff should issue a license to carry a concealed firearm, 18 Pa.C.S. § 6109, and the statute that enumerates certain disabilities that prevent a person from owning or possessing a firearm in the first place, 18 Pa.C.S. § 6105, address different societal safety interests. M.S.W.’s challenge to the Sheriff’s decision to revoke his license to carry is misplaced for two reasons. First, the Sheriff has no discretion to issue a license to carry when, as alleged here, the individual is of unsound mind or has been committed to a mental institution. See 18 Pa.C.S. § 6109(e)(1)(v). So it’s the underlying disability that’s at issue and not the Sheriff’s discretion. Second, the time for challenging the Sheriff’s determination was 30 days after receipt of the letter notifying M.S.W. of the decision. See *In re Christopher Edwards Appeal*, No. 1845-M of 2001, 2002 Pa. Dist. & Cnty.

individual to the firearms prohibition in Section 6105(c)(4) of the Firearms Act, 18 Pa.C.S. § 6105(c)(4).

We held two hearings. At the first one, M.S.W. introduced his medical records from the Hershey Medical Center. And PSP introduced the 302-commitment paperwork and the trooper's police report. Between the hearings, M.S.W. filed a statement of the facts relied on in the medical records. And PSP filed a memorandum and position statement. During the second hearing, M.S.W. testified to the events attending his traffic stop and that he has never had any mental health history. He also introduced and we admitted a letter from his family doctor noting the absence of any mental illness history and that he has, among other ailments, diabetes.

The central contention among the parties lies with whether an adequate basis exists to expunge M.S.W.'s 302 commitment. On this, PSP stresses that we are confined to what the emergency room physician stated on the 302 form: M.S.W. had made "[a]ctive suicide statements with no plan, but clear intent." See (N.T. 6/29/26 at 27). M.S.W., on the other hand, points to the status of the attending physician as a non-psychiatric emergency room doctor who was only two years out of medical school, in other words, a "resident." (N.T. 6/29/26 at 31). And he relies on the psychiatric evaluation that: M.S.W. "does not require inpatient psychiatric treatment at this time. [M.S.W.] does not meet the criteria for involuntary evaluation and treatment under the PA Mental Health Procedures Act of 1976, section 7302. Would recommend reversal of 302."

III.

Discussion

We begin with the basis for the involuntary commitment. Section 302 of the Mental Health Procedures Act permits an individual, like M.S.W., to be involuntarily committed for 120 hours:

Upon written application by a physician or other responsible party setting forth facts constituting reasonable grounds to believe a person is *severely mentally disabled* and in need of immediate

treatment, the county administrator may issue a warrant requiring a person authorized by him, or any peace officer, to take such person to the facility specified in the warrant.

50 P.S. § 7302(a)(1) (emphasis added). Severe mental disability is defined as “when, as a result of mental illness, his capacity to exercise self-control, judgment and discretion in the conduct of his affairs and social relations or to care for his own personal needs is so lessened that he poses a clear and present danger of harm to others or to himself[.]” 50 P.S. § 7301(a).

As is relevant here, a clear and present danger means that:

[T]he person has acted in such manner as to evidence that he would be unable, without care, supervision and the continued assistance of others, to satisfy his need for nourishment, personal or medical care, shelter, or self-protection and safety, and that there is a reasonable probability that death, serious bodily injury or serious physical debilitation would ensue within 30 days unless adequate treatment were afforded under this act[.]

Id. at § 7301(b)(2)(i). Notably, in seeking to commit M.S.W., the trooper did not invoke the suicide provision in Section 7301(b)(2)(ii). See (PSP Ex. “A” at 4).

Expungement

Section 6111.1(g)(2) of the Firearms Act permits a person involuntarily committed under Section 302 to petition a court to review the sufficiency of the evidence supporting the commitment. 18 Pa.C.S. § 6111.1(g)(2). However, the scope of this Court’s review is circumscribed. We are limited to reviewing the physician’s findings made at the time of the commitment in assessing whether the evidence known by the physician and in the contemporaneous record supported the conclusion that M.S.W. required commitment under Section 301. See *In re Vencil*, 152 A.3d 235, 242, 246 (Pa. 2017). The Mental Health Procedures Act allows no judicial involvement in the decision for a 302 commitment. See *id.* at 245. And the limited remedies for reviewing commitment are impractical given the 120-hour timeframe. Cf. 50 P.S. § 7113.

Still, Section 6111.1(g)(2) of the Firearms Act neither permits this Court to redetermine the commitment nor creates a right to judicial intervention. See *In re Vencil*, 152 A.3d at 245. A challenge to the sufficiency of the evidence supporting a commitment

presents a pure question of law and is thus subject to de novo review. See *In re M.A.C.*, 316 A.3d 163, 172 (Pa. Super. 2024). But our review is deferential to the committing physician, requiring only that their finding be supported by a preponderance of the evidence. See *id.*⁶

Even with the limited scope of review and deferential standard, this case presents a close question. To begin, M.S.W. argues that the status of the attending physician as a resident emergency room doctor has bearing on our sufficiency review. We decline to give this any weight for two reasons. First, Section 302 does not require the physician to have a particular status or specialized training. Although *Vencil's* rationale references reliance on the physician's "particularized training," we assume that this language refers to training as a physician. *In re Vencil*, 152 A.3d at 3246. Second, the psychiatric evaluation relied on by M.S.W. was also conducted by a resident, albeit one in the psychiatric unit. See (Pet. Ex. "A" at 14) (Dr. Saunders noting that she did not personally see M.S.W.). And with both the initial commitment and the later psychiatric evaluation, supervising physicians signed off, so to speak, on the assessments.

The evaluation of M.S.W. does cause us concern for other reasons. While *Vencil* limits what this Court can review in our sufficiency analysis, what if the attending physician simply ignored an obvious explanation for M.S.W.'s demeanor? Here, M.S.W. was 64 years-of-age and had no history of mental health treatment. But he had diabetes, an insulin pump, and extraordinarily low blood sugar. See (Pet. Ex. "A" at 6, 52, 149). Moreover, given M.S.W.'s alcohol consumption, hypoglycemia should have been on someone's radar. See (Pet. Ex. "A" at 149) (stating that M.S.W.'s alcohol intoxication caused glucose depletion); see also Johns Hopkins Medicine, *Mixing Alcohol with Your Diabetes* (Diabetes Educ. – #16).⁷

Turning to M.S.W.'s reliance on the psychiatric evaluation and conclusions, this is a more difficult proposition. PSP argues that we should treat the psychiatric evaluation as

⁶ The *Vencil* Court rested its reasoning respecting the deferential review standard on the fact that no constitutional liberty interest was at stake in a proceeding under Section 6111.1(g)(2). See *In re Vencil*, 152 A.3d 245. But the Court acknowledged that there is a constitutional interest under the Second Amendment and Article 1, Section 21 of the Pennsylvania Constitution. See *id.* M.S.W., however, did not raise a constitutional argument respecting the review standard.

after-the-fact and thus, based on *Vencil*, outside our scope of review.⁸ But this circumstance is very unusual in a couple of respects. First, the physicians who authored and signed the psychiatric evaluation recommended reversing the 302-commitment. They could have, for instance, simply recommended discharging M.S.W. Second, their evaluation did not arise as part of an effort to challenge the sufficiency of the commitment under Section 6111.1(g)(2). *Cf. In re Vencil*, 152 A.3d at 239-40. Rather, it was part and parcel to the requested “[i]n patient psychiatric assessment, diagnosis and treatment . . . protocol.” (PSP Ex. “A” at 9). This situation, therefore, substantially differs from the factual backdrop that animated *Vencil*.

More important, the basis for M.S.W.’s commitment was Section 301(b)(2)(i). But that subsection addresses the inability to care for oneself. See 50 P.S. § 304(a)(1) (describing the bases for involuntary commitment). Here, nothing indicated that M.S.W. was neglecting serious medical treatment, or that he was unable to safely complete the activities of daily living. *E.g., In re S.B.*, 777 A.2d 454, 458 (Pa. Super. 2000) (explaining that Section 301(b)(2)(i) criteria are met where patient refused to take her medication for depression and anxiety; refused meals; her hygiene was poor; and she was unable to approach the staff for help if she felt suicidal). Instead, he had too much to drink, his glucose level dropped, and he was hypoglycemic.⁹ He appears to have recognized that his blood sugar was low as he requested that the trooper allow him to eat something before transporting him.

PSP’s argument and the 302-commitment paperwork focus on M.S.W.’s suicidal ideation. But M.S.W.’s conduct did not meet the standard for commitment under that statutory subsection. *Cf.* 50 P.S. § 301(b)(2)(ii) (requiring, among other things, a suicide attempt). And we have no authority to alter the scope of a different statutory subsection to reach conduct not included therein. Indeed, such an argument would render subsection (b)(2)(ii) surplusage. See 1 Pa.C.S. § 1922(2); ANTONIN SCALIA & BRYAN A. GARNER, *READING LAW: THE INTERPRETATION OF LEGAL TEXTS* 174-79 (2012) (addressing the surplusage canon).

⁸ PSP’s argument would logically extend to the later emergency room evaluation of M.S.W. by the “teaching physician.” (Pet. Ex. “A” at 2). But such extension seems incongruous given the process at a teaching hospital like the Penn State Milton S. Hershey Medical Center.

⁹ It’s true that the medical records have entries indicating that M.S.W. appeared “unkempt” and “disheveled,” but those observations are, in our view, too thin a reed to support a finding that he was severely mentally disabled and therefore incapable of caring for himself. And none of the information obtained from M.S.W.’s wife suggested that he was unable to care for himself. See (Pet. Ex. “A” at 12).

In our view, accordingly, there was an insufficient basis to involuntarily commit M.S.W. under 50 P.S. §§ 7301(b)(2)(i) & 7302.

Restoration of firearms right

As an alternative holding, we proceed to address the restoration of M.S.W.'s right to own and possess firearms. The Firearms Act allows the restoration of firearms rights for those involuntarily committed under Section 302:

Upon application to the court of common pleas under this subsection by an applicant subject to the prohibitions under subsection (c)(4), the court may grant such relief as it deems appropriate if the court determines that the applicant may possess a firearm without risk to the applicant or any other person.

18 Pa.C.S. § 6105(f)(1). This provision extends to this Court considerable discretion in deciding whether M.S.W.'s right to own and possess a firearm should be restored. *See In re E.H.*, 233 A.3d 820, 824 (Pa. Super. 2020). At the outset, having had an opportunity to observe M.S.W. during the hearing, we credit his testimony. We also rely on the Hershey Medical Center psychiatric evaluation. For many of the same reasons outlined above, we believe that M.S.W.'s right to own and possess firearms should be restored.¹⁰

To reiterate, the involuntary 302 commitment was mistaken. M.S.W. was not severely mentally disabled—he was under the influence of alcohol and hypoglycemic. He has no history of mental health treatment. And he was committed under a provision that requires proof that he was unable to care for himself. Yet there's no evidence of that. To the contrary, he has been gainfully employed, owns a home, is married, and was not refusing medication or food.

¹⁰ Independent of the expungement decision, our belief that M.S.W.'s right to own and possess a firearm should be restored does not resolve whether he may be prosecuted under the corresponding federal statute, 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(4). *See Doe v. Governor of Pa.*, 977 F.3d 270, 274 (3d Cir. 2020); *In re Keys*, 83 A.3d 1016, 1020 (Pa. Super. 2013); *but c.f. Wilborn v. Barr*, 401 F. Supp. 3d 501, 506 (E.D. Pa. 2019) (holding that the wording in Section 922(g)(4) does not encompass a commitment under Section 302); *Franklin v. Sessions*, 291 F. Supp. 3d 705, 714-17 (W.D. Pa. 2017) (same). These cases, however, pre-date *New York State Rifle & Pistol Assn., Inc. v. Bruen*, 597 U. S. 1 (2022), which substantially altered the test for challenging a firearm regulation. In any event and as noted, M.S.W. has not included a constitutional challenge as part of his claim, and any challenge to Section 922(g)(4) would have to be brought in federal district court.

In sum, this Court finds that M.S.W. may own and possess firearms and that he poses no risk to himself or others.

IV.

AND NOW, this 10th day of July, we enter the following **ORDER**:

The Pennsylvania State Police shall expunge all records of M.S.W.'s involuntary mental health commitment consistent with 18 Pa.C.S. § 6111.1(g)(2);

Alternatively, M.S.W.'s right to own and possess firearms is restored consistent with 18 Pa.C.S. § 6105(f)(1).
