OPINION

Linda R. Cordaro, J.

November 2, 2022

Currently before the Court is Defendant's Preliminary Objection to Plaintiffs' Complaint filed by Defendants Eric Schaff, M.D. and Cherry Tree Pediatrics, P.C. on July 14, 2022. Plaintiffs' Complaint asserts claims by E.F. (minor child) via her parent, Plaintiff Juarez, for professional negligence, vicarious liability, and direct negligence, and a claim by Plaintiff Juarez herself for negligent infliction of emotional distress. Defendant's sole preliminary objection challenges the legal sufficiency of this negligent infliction of emotional distress claim under Pa.R.Civ.P. 1028(a)(4).

BACKGROUND

This matter arises from circumstances that occurred between May 2021 and June 2021. As pled in the Complaint, on May 31, 2021, eleven-year-old Minor-Plaintiff spent much of the day using the family's trampoline. That evening, she told her mother, Plaintiff Juarez, that she was experiencing pain in the back of her legs. The following day, June 1, 2021, Minor-Plaintiff told her mother that her feet felt as if they were falling asleep. Later that afternoon, she experienced pains in her feet and legs and had trouble walking. Plaintiff Juarez contacted Defendant Cherry Tree Pediatrics and spoke to Defendant Dr. Schaff, who advised her to bring Minor-Plaintiff to the office.

Minor-Plaintiff required assistance to get into the car and, on arrival at Cherry Tree Pediatrics, could not walk. Defendant Dr. Schaff came to the parking lot to see her, and advised Plaintiff Juarez that her daughter's condition was likely a "stinger" and would resolve on its own. He did not call for an ambulance to take the child to an emergency room.

The following day, June 2, 2021, Minor-Plaintiffs symptoms worsened, and by early afternoon, she had no sensation from the waist down. Plaintiff Juarez called EMS, and Minor-Plaintiff was taken by Life Flight to Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh.

Minor-Plaintiff ultimately was diagnosed with transverse myelitis, a condition that involves inflammation of the spinal cord and requires urgent medical attention. She suffered irreversible injury to her spinal cord and is now permanently immobile, confined to a wheelchair, and has bowel and bladder dysfunction.

The Complaint asserts that Plaintiff Juarez witnessed the negligent treatment of her daughter by Defendant Dr. Schaff, her daughter's suffering and deterioration, and the culmination of her daughter's condition in irreversible neurological compromise. As a result, Plaintiff Juarez suffered extreme emotional distress.

DISCUSSION

A consideration of preliminary objections challenging the legal sufficiency of a pleading requires that a court accept as true "all well and clearly pleaded material, factual averments and all inferences fairly deducible therefrom." Sinn v. Burd, 404 A.2d 672,674 (Pa. 1979). The examination of the complaint is to determine "whether it sets forth a cause of action which, if proved, would entitle the party to the relief sought." Id. A preliminary objection is properly sustained only if the complaint fails to do this. Id.

In Pennsylvania, a cause of action for negligent infliction of emotional distress is limited to four (4) factual scenarios: (1) the defendant had a contractual or fiduciary duty to the plaintiff; (2) the plaintiff was subjected to physical impact; (3) plaintiff was in a zone of danger and thereby reasonably experienced fear of impending physical injury; or (4) the plaintiff observed a tortious injury to a close relative. Toney v. Chester Cnty. Hosp., 961 A.2d 192, 197-98 (Pa. Super. Ct. 2008), order aff d by an equally divided court, 36 A.3d 83 (Pa. 2011).

In the fourth scenario, the alleged cause of injury to a close relative may be the negligence of a physician, and although the negligence and the injury need not occur at the same time, a plaintiff still must have a "sensory and contemporaneous observance of the injury." Love v. Cramer, 606 A.2d 1175, 1178 (Pa. Super. Ct. 1992) (finding that a plaintiff had a cause of action after she witnessed a doctor fail to order further tests or treatment for her mother and later observed her mother's fatal heart attack).

Furthermore, the event alleged to have inflicted the distress upon the plaintiff must be "discrete and identifiable" in order to trigger recovery. Berardi v. Johns-Manville Corp., 482 A.2d 1067, 1071 (Pa. Super. Ct. 1984) (citingAmader v. Johns-Manville Corp. 514 F.Supp. 1031, 1032 (E.D.Pa. 1981)). A plaintiffs observation of the development of a disease over time does not qualify. See e.g., Tackett v. Encke, 509 A.2d 1310, 1312 (Pa. Super. Ct. 1986) (finding that a mother had not alleged a "discrete and identifiable traumatic event," when she observed, over several weeks, her son's reaction to a negligently undetected pulmonary embolism); Berardi, 482 A.2d at 1071 (stating that a plaintiff could not recover when she had suffered emotional distress from observing the development of her husband's asbestosis).

Defendants' Preliminary Objection is based on the argument that because Plaintiffs allege the injury to Minor-Plaintiff began prior to the visit to Defendant Dr. Schaff and continued to develop afterward, it is an injury taking place over a period of time and therefore is not a "discrete and identifiable" event.

The initial presentation of Minor-Plaintiffs symptoms did begin before the June 1, 2021 visit to Defendant Dr. Schaff. However, after the doctor's allegedly negligent care, the Minor-Plaintiffs condition worsened so rapidly that the very next day she required transport by Life Flight to Pittsburgh. In contrast to the weeks in which the plaintiff in Tackett observed her son's decline and the months in which the plaintiff in Bernardi observed the progression of her husband's asbestosis, the time it took for Minor-Plaintiffs deterioration is extremely short. Furthermore, after the June 1, 2021 visit, Minor-Plaintiff lost all sensation below her waist and ultimately lost her ability to walk altogether.

Given the very short span of time involved as well as the drastic and irreversible loss of function Minor-Plaintiff experienced after Defendant Dr. Schaffs allegedly negligent care, Plaintiffs may be able to prove that Plaintiff Juarez indeed did observe a discrete and identifiable traumatic event.

Defendants' Preliminary Objection is overruled.

ORDER

AND NOW, this 2nd day of November 2022, after consideration of Defendants' Preliminary Objection, Plaintiffs' responsive brief, and oral argument on the matter, it is hereby ORDERED that Defendants' sole Preliminary Objection of the legal insufficiency of Plaintiffs' claim of negligent infliction of emotional distress is OVERRULED.
