OPINION AND ORDER

GEORGE, J. June 13, 2023

This matter comes before the Court on Defendant's Omnibus Pretrial Motion in the form of a petition for writ of habeas corpus. On May 23, 2023; a hearing was held on Defendant's Omnibus Pretrial Motion. The parties stipulated to the admission of the transcript from the preliminary hearing and brief legal argument. After the hearing and reviewing the Preliminary Hearing Transcript, this motion is DENIED in its entirety.

ISSUES PRESENTED

Defendant's motion presents the following issue whether the Commonwealth has established a prima facie case for Aggravated Assault $\{1\}$, Simple Assault $\{2\}$, and Terroristic Threats $\{3\}$.

FACTS

On January 19, 2023, Pennsylvania State Police responded to the Albert Gallatin School District for a report of a disturbance. Upon arrival at the school, School Police Officer Carl Guthrie and School Police Officer James Pierce relayed to the State Police information regarding an incident that occurred with Defendant, Phillip Mosley. Officer Guthrie and Officer Pierce testified at the Preliminary Hearing that the Defendant came to the school with his 'girlfriend to pick up her son. Officer Guthrie told the Defendant and his girlfriend to empty their pockets and proceed through a metal detector'. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 12). When the Defendant emptied his pockets a clear plastic baggie of what appeared to be marijuana fell on to the ground. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 12-13). Officer Guthrie pointed out to the Defendant that he had dropped something. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 12-13). The Defendant picked up the baggie and put it back into his pocket. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 12-13).

Officer Guthrie then took Defendant and his girlfriend into the office waiting area and notified Officer Pierce of the suspected marijuana. Officer Pierce then confronted the Defendant and asked him if he had a bag of marijuana on his person. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 4). Defendant confirmed that he did. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 4). When Officer Pierce asked the Defendant to turn over the marijuana the Defendant declined to do so. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 4-5). The Defendant yelled multiple threats at Officer Pierce, including

"I will kill you." (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 5). As the Defendant left the building, he again threatened Officer Pierce saying "look me up, I know where to find you, I will kill you." (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 5). At some point during this aggressive exchange the Defendant took his shirt off and postured himself as if to initiate a fight with Officer Pierce, bumping his chest into Officer Pierce multiple times. Office1 · Pierce testified on direct e amination that he heard the Defendant say "I will shoot you" and the Defendant's actions and threats put him in fear of imminent bodily injury. (Prelim. Hr'g Tr. p. 6).

DISCUSSION Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus

In an Omnibus Pretrial Petition for Habeas Corpus relief, the Court must determine whether the Commonwealth established a prima facie case for the charged offenses. Com. v. Packard, 767 A.2d 1068, 1070 (Pa. Super. 2001). "When deciding whether a prima facie case was established, [the Court] must view the evidence in the light most favorable to the Commonwealth, and ... consider all reasonable inferences based on that evidence which could support a guilty verdict." Com. v. James, 863 A.2d 1179, 1182 (Pa. Super. Ct. 2004) (citation omitted). Unlike the beyond a reasonable doubt standard, a prima facie case is merely a degree of evidence "that if presented at the trial in court, and accepted as true, the judge would be warranted in allowing the case to go to the jury." Com. v. Wojdak, 466 A.2d 991, 996 (Pa. 1983); see James, 863 A.2d at 1182.

A person is guilty of aggravated assault if he or she attempts by physical menace to put any of the officers, agents, employees or other persons enumerated in subsection (c), while in the performance of duty, in fear of imminent serious bodily injury {4}.

A person is guilty of simple assault if he or she attempts by physical menace to put another in fear of imminent serious bodily injury.

A person is guilty of terroristic threats if he or she communicates, either directly or indirectly, a threat to commit any crime of violence with the intent to terrorize another. At the preliminary hearing, Officer Pierce testified that the Defendant: 1) shouted numerous threats to kill him; 2) took off his shirt and gestured to initiate a fight; 3) aggressively bumped his chest into him; and 4) threatened to shoot him. Officer Pierce also testified on direct examination that he was in fear of imminent bodily injury from the Defendant. This testimony viewed in a light most favorable to the Commonwealth establishes a prima facie case for aggravated assault, simple assault and terroristic threats.

WHEREFORE, we will enter the following order:

ORDER

AND NOW, this 13th day of June, 2023, in accordance with our foregoing opinion, it is hereby ORDERED and DECREED that the Omnibus Pre Trial Motion is DENIED, in its entirety. The District Attorney is DIRECTED to list this matter for trial.
