## **JUDICIAL OPINION**

IN THE COURT OF COMMON PLEAS OF FAYETTE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA CIVIL ACTION

IN RE: PETITION FOR RECOUNT OF THE DEMOCRATIC PRIMARY ELECTION

OF MAY 20, 2025 FOR SUPERVISOR OF HENRY CLAY TOWNSHIP : No. 1332 of 2025, G.D. : Judge Joseph M. George, Jr.

#### OPINION AND ORDER

GEORGE, J. July 7, 2025

Before the Court is a matter that originated with a Petition for Recount of the Democratic Primary Election held on May 20, 2025 for Supervisor of Henry Clay Township filed on June 9, 2025. On June 13, 2025, the Court authorized a recount.

On June 18, 2025, the Fayette County Election Bureau filed a Report of Recount. The Director of Elections indicated that "several ballots were discovered containing write-in votes for the above candidates without the write-in oval filled in on the ballot." The instructions on the ballot provide that "to vote for a person whose name is not on the ballot, write the person's name legibly in the blank space and fill in the oval."

On June 23, 2025, Petitioners filed a response and objection to the report relying on the authority set forth in Shambaugh v. Bickhart, 845 A.2d 793 (Pa. 2004).

On July 3, 2025, the Court held a hearing on the objection. The parties stipulated that there was no fraud in the count or recount and the parties also stipulated to the admission of six ballots (identified as Joint Exhibit A, 1-6). Two of the ballots cast had a write-in vote for Steve Humbert, but the corresponding oval was not filled in. The remaining four ballots each cast a write-in vote for Jesse Bates. These four voters also did not fill in the oval next to the area where the candidate's name was written.

This Opinion is in support of our Order which will direct the Election Bureau to count the votes where the Court believes the voter intent expressed on the challenged ballots is unmistakably clear.

#### DISCUSSION

Under Pennsylvania law, "Election laws will be strictly enforced to prevent fraud, but ordinarily will be construed liberally in favor of the right to vote." Appeal of James, 105 A.2d 64, 65 (Pa. 1954).

In Rinaldi v. Ferrett, 941 A.2d 73 (Pa.Cmwlth.2007), when confronted with a similar issue, the Commonwealth Court heavily relied on the Supreme Court case of Shambach v. Bickhart, 845 A.2d 793 (Pa. 2004). Though the Court did not reach the merits, it addressed the "longstanding and overriding policy" that says that absent fraud, election laws should be construed liberally "so that minor irregularities in casting a vote result in striking that vote only if there exists compelling reason." Id. at p. 80. In the instance of votes lacking a fully blackened oval, the Court held, "[W]here voter intent is clear and there is no sign of fraud, we concluded that, absent an express statutory prohibition, the rationale favoring liberal construction would allow counting of the ballots despite the lack of a fully blackened oval. Therefore, had we reached the merits, we would have affirmed."

In a previous matter where the identical issue was raised, {1} this Court was guided by the following authority:

The power to throw out a ballot for minor irregularities, like the power to throw out the entire poll of an election district for irregularities, must be exercised very sparingly and with the idea in mind that either an individual voter or a group of voters are not to be disfranchised at an election except for compelling reasons.

\*\*\* 'The purpose in holding elections is to register the actual expression of the electorate's will' and that 'computing judges' should endeavor 'to see what was the true result,' There should be the same reluctance to throw out a single ballot as there is to throw out an entire district poll, for sometimes an election hinges on one vote.

Appeal of James, 377 Pa. 405, 409-410, 105 A.2d 64, 66 (quoting Appeal of Gallagher, 351 Pa. 451, 454-455, 41 A.2d 630,632 (1945)).

Applying these same principles here, the Court believes that the voter intent expressed on the challenged ballots is unmistakably clear, there has been a stipulation of no fraud and the failure to check a box on the ballot or fill in an oval is a minor irregularity, not a compelling reason to throw out said ballot.

As our Supreme Court has observed, "[m]arking a ballot in voting is a matter not of precision engineering but of an unmistakable registration of the voter's will in substantial conformity to statutory requirements." Appeal of James, 377 Pa. at 408, 105 A.2d at 65 (quoting Appeal of Gallagher, 351 Pa. at 456, 41 A.2d at 632). Not to count these votes would give too much weight to a technicality against which our Supreme Court warned in Appeal of James.

Wherefore, we will enter the following order that affirms the actual expression of the will of the electorate:

#### ORDER

AND NOW, this 7th day of July, 2025, in accordance with the foregoing opinion, the Election Bureau is DIRECTED to correct, compute and certify the votes in accordance with the intent of the voter as follows:

- 1. The two ballots identified in Joint Exhibit A, 1 and 2 with a write-in vote for Steve Humbert, without the corresponding oval filled in by the voter, shall be COUNTED as two votes for Steve Humbert; and
- 2. The four ballots identified in Joint Exhibit A, 3, 4, 5, and 6 with a write-in vote for Jesse Bates, without the corresponding oval filled in by the voter, shall be four votes COUNTED for Jesse Bates.
