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# **JUDICIAL OPINION**

IN THE COURT OF COMMON PLEAS OF FAYETTE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA CRIMINAL DIVISION

COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA

**OPINION** 

Wagner, S.J. June 24, 2025

After a trial by jury that commenced on April 21, 2025 and ended on April 22, 2025, the jury rendered verdicts of guilty on twenty-three (23) counts of Forgery; one count of Dealing in Proceeds of Unlawful Activities; three (3) counts of various forms of theft charges; one count of Receiving Stolen Property; and one count of Misapplication of Entrusted Property. The Defendant was sentenced on April 30, 2025 to thirty-one (31) to one hundred and twenty (120) months incarceration and ordered to pay restitution in the total amount of one hundred and twelve thousand four hundred and eighty-four dollars and ninety-nine cents. (\$112,484.99) plus fines and costs.

### STATEMENT OF ISSUE RAISED ON APPEAL

1. WHETHER THE COURT ERRED IN FAILING TO DISMISS THE INSTANT MATTER, PRIOR TO TRIAL, UNDER 18 PA.C.S. § 110, WHICH GOVERNS COMPULSORY JOINDER OF CRIMINAL MATTERS DUE TO THE INTRODUCTION OF EVIDENCE FROM THIS MATTER AND THE USE OF SAID EVIDENCE IN ARGUMENT, BY THE COMMONWEALTH, IN A PRIOR, RELATED CRIMINAL TRIAL.

### **BACKGROUND**

In February 2023, the members of the Board of Directors and Private Council of the Youghiogheny Western Baptist Association (hereinafter "YWBA") made a complaint to District Attorney Richard Bower. YWBA is a religious association of twenty-seven individual Baptist churches with its principal office located in Uniontown, Fayette County, Pennsylvania. The association is comprised of Baptist churches located in Fayette, Greene, Westmoreland and Allegheny County in Pennsylvania with one church located in Morgantown, West Virginia. The members of the YWBA are volunteers who serve without compensation. Funding for the YWBA comes from annual membership dues from each of the twenty-seven churches.

The officers of the YWBA with their legal counsel met with Trooper Eberhardt and Steven Kontaxes, a forensic accountant who is an expert in complex financial criminal investigations. At the meeting, the representatives of the YWBA informed the Trooper and others present that they had determined that one of their trusted officers, the Defendant herein, had been stealing funds from their accounts over a period of years. Members of the YWBA became suspicious when they discovered that invoices and bills had not been paid. The Association was in debt to creditors and at risk of losing essential services. The organization's general checking account and Money Market bank account had been secretly depleted. The Appellant had used her position in the organization to gain control of the finances of the organization, the check book and finances.

They further informed the Trooper that the Appellant had gained control of the organization's post office box and was intercepting shut off notices. In December of 2022, the YWBA voted to remove her from her position and brought the issue to the District Attorney. The District Attorney obtained subpoenas from the Gand Jury to investigate how the funds were spent from the YWBA's checking and Money Market accounts. The YWBA's accounts were held by the First National Bank. Evidence of fraud was found with numerous fraudulent checks were written payable to the Appellant. On review, it was apparent that numerous checks that were to be signed by multiple board members; Bradford Francis, Sandra Tracy, and Andrea Myers; had not been signed by them. Twelve (12) fraudulent checks were made out to the Appellant, other fraudulent checks were made out to "Cash" and it was ultimately determined that one hundred and twelve thousand four hundred and eighty-four dollars and ninety-nine cents (\$112,484.99) was removed from the two accounts. The first identified fraudulent check was dated in July of 2018.

During the investigation by the Pennsylvania State Police, it was discovered that the Appellant frequented numerous casinos in Fayette and surrounding counties. In addition, a witness was located who worked in a local convenience store who testified that she had observed the Appellant in the store on a near daily basis spending approximately one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per day on games of chance and purchasing lottery tickets. The information was presented to the Grand Jury seated on August 24, 2022 who issued a presentment approving the charges.

The Appellant was investigated related to another case, Fayette County Case Number 963 of 2013 and Superior Court Number 544 WDA 2025. After a trial by jury before the Honorable President Judge Steve P. Leskinen, the Defendant was convicted of the following charges: Receiving Stolen Property, Theft by Failure to Make Required Disposition of Funds, Perjury, Misapplication of Entrusted Property and Property of Government Financial Institutions, and Obstructing the Administration of Law or Other Governmental Function. This case was prosecuted by the Attorney General's Office. This case involved the Appellant's actions as the elected Treasurer of the City of Uniontown. The Treasurer's Office had two employees in addition to the Treasurer. After taking office in January, 2020, the Appellant in her role as Treasurer changed procedures so that she was the only person who made all bank deposits. The Treasurer's Office receives and deposits City tax payments, payments made to the Sewer System Fund and the money paid into the Tobacco Fund. Initially all funds paid into the office went into the City's Tax Clearing Account. Prior to her election, all funds received each day were paid into the Tax Clearing Account on that day. The Appellant changed that procedure and deposited funds periodically. The funds were reconciled daily using the receipts written that day and the amount on the calculator tape. The staff verbally confirmed the amount received each day. The funds were to be deposited in the bank, or deposited in the safe in the Treasurer's Office if the Appellant did not go to the bank.

### ARGUMENT

The Appellant asserts that the Court erred when it failed to dismiss this case prior to trial pursuant to 18 Pa. C.S.A.§ 110, the compulsory joinder statute, due to the introduction of facts from this case in the first trial and the use of those facts in the Commonwealth's final argument. In the first case, the Attorney General stated during the trial that the Appellant had manipulated herself into a position in the church to gain access to the organization's checkbook and wrote checks to herself so she could use their funds to

support her gambling habit.

The compulsory joinder statute was designed to serve two (2) distinct policy considerations: (1) to protect a person accused of a crime from governmental harassment by having multiple trials for offenses stemming from the same criminal episode and (2) to ensure judicial economy. 18 Pa. C.S.A. § 110. A prosecution will only be barred by the compulsory joinder statute if: (1) the former prosecution resulted in an acquittal or in a conviction; (2) the instant prosecution is based on the same criminal conduct or arose from the same criminal episode as the former prosecution; (3) the prosecutor was aware of the instant charges before the commencement of the trial on the former charges; and (4) the instant charges were within the jurisdiction of a single court. Id.

Evidence from other crimes may be admissible for a wide variety of evidentiary purposes but that fact alone does not prove a logical connection between the acts so as to constitute a single criminal episode. Commonwealth v. Spatz, 756 A.2d 1139 (Pa. 2000). To determine whether various acts constitute a single criminal episode, a court must consider two (2) factors: (1) the logical relationship between the acts, and (2) the temporal relationship between the acts. Id.

At the trial in the Uniontown City Treasurer's case, a witness testified for the Commonwealth regarding the facts in the church case to present a pattern of the Appellant's behavior in her dealing with other agencies. The evidence was introduced as evidence of prior bad acts pursuant to Pa. R.C.E. 404(b) to show the pattern in her behavior to support her gambling habit. The introduction of this evidence is permissible and does not trigger the compulsory joinder statute. While the charges in both cases arise from thefts of funds, the cases do not arise from the same criminal episode or the same criminal conduct. In the first prosecution, the Appellant ran for public office and was elected to act as the Treasurer for the City of Uniontown. Once in office, the Appellant took tax funds collected from citizens, failed to deposit the funds, and then used the funds to gamble and cover personal expenses. In the YWBA case, the Appellant was active in the church organization and was appointed to a position in the organization that gave her access to the checkbook. The Appellant then forged the names of officers of the organization on the checks that she made out either to cash or to herself. The motive for the thefts was to finance her daily gambling. The purpose of the thefts was the same but the scheme and pattern were different. The evidence was presented established a lack of mistake. The presentation of this information did not establish compulsory joinder for the two cases.

The acts by the Appellant were clearly part of a separate scheme in each case, with a difference pattern of theft in each case. In this case, the Appellant victimized a church organization by forging checks with the names of organization officers, while in the Treasurer's case, she took tax money paid into her office and failed to deposit it in the City accounts.

For the above stated reasons, the Court respectfully requests that the appeal filed by the Appellant be dismissed.
